Pop by the farm gate during the main growing season April - September and you will find 'Friday flowers' available. Flowers can also be ordered for regular orders or one off occasions.

Flowery workshops are held regularly through the year including wreath making at Christmas.

STOP! Any photos or posts that let people know your home is unoccupied could be creating a potential opportunity for thieves, especially if your profile isn't set to private. And if the worst does happen, you could invalidate your home insurance and have your claim refused.

Posting a few images of your time away may not be enough on its own to lead to an invalidated claim, but oversharing online could make the insurer call into question the 'reasonable care' of the property— making it wise to be cautious, turn off location settings when posting, or the best option - wait until you get home
